NAESB 101 WEBINAR

As you may know, NAESB is an American National Standards Institute (ANSI) accredited, non-profit standards development organization formed with the support of the U.S. Department of Energy (DoE) for the purpose of developing voluntary standards and model business practices that promote more competitive and efficient natural gas and electric markets. NAESB and its predecessor organization, the Gas Industry Standards Board (GISB), have developed voluntary consensus based standards for over twenty years, and with few exceptions, all NAESB wholesale market standards have been adopted by the U.S. Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) and mandated as federal regulation for federally jurisdictional entities, and many of the NAESB retail market standards have served as a basis for regulation adopted by various U.S. state commissions. NAESB maintains a membership of over three hundred corporate members representing the wholesale gas, wholesale electric, retail gas and retail electric markets and has more than two-thousand participants that contribute to the standards development.

As NAESB nears almost a quarter of a century supporting the industry, NAESB staff will host a free one hour webinar designed to introduce attendees to NAESB and explain how our work supports the efforts of the markets. The webinar will provide basic information about the organization and the standards development process, the organization's relationship with government agencies and other external bodies. Additionally, we will review the existing body of NAESB standards, and discuss how membership or participation within NAESB may be beneficial to your organization.
