

## **WORKPAPER – RECALL NOTIFICATION**

### **5.3.z2 Proposed Standard**

For recall notification provided to the Transportation Service Provider (TSP) prior to the recall notification deadline specified in NAESB WGQ Standard No. [5.3.z1] and received between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., the TSP should provide notification to all affected Replacement Shippers no later than one hour after receipt of such recall notification.

For recall notification provided to the TSP after 5:00 p.m. and prior to 7:00 a.m., the TSP should provide notification to all affected Replacement Shippers no later than 8:00 a.m. after receipt of such recall notification. (Central Clock Time)

### **Excerpt from July 26, 2002 Order in Docket No. RP02-246-000, paragraph 9:**

9. Lastly, the Dominion LDCs protest DTI's proposal to limit pipeline notification to replacement shippers to business hours. The Commission rejects DTI's proposal as contrary to NAESB Standard 1.3.4, which provides all parties should support a seven-days-a-week, twenty-four-hours-a-day nominations process. Recall of capacity is part of the nomination and scheduling process. DTI is required to file a substitute tariff sheet within 15 days of the date of this order that removes this limitation.

### **NAESB Standard 1.3.4**

All parties should support a seven-days-a-week, twenty-four-hours-a-day nominations process. It is recognized that the success of seven days a week, twenty-four hours a day nominations process is dependent on the availability of affected parties' scheduling personnel on a similar basis. Party contacts need not be at their ordinary work sites but should be available by telephone or beeper.
