

## Cross Contract Ranking Examples

Scenario: Service Requester nominates 550 Dth to a location using various contracts and routes within the contract. Capacity allocation by TSP's will continue to be done based on tariff priorities. During confirmations the operators agree that only 400 Dth will flow at location point Z. What contracts and routes will flow the gas? What is the requirement for cross contract ranking? The following two examples provide different results and both could be considered cross contract ranking.

Example 1:

<u>Contract</u>	<u>Route</u>	<u>Ranking</u>	<u>Nomination</u>	<u>Scheduled Nomination</u>
ABC	A-Z	1	200	200
	B-Z	3	100	50
DEF	E-Z	4	50	0
GHI	F-Z	3	100	50
	G-Z	1	100	100

- Utilizes existing data elements in a nomination data set.

Example 2:

<u>Rank</u>	<u>Contract</u>	<u>Route</u>	<u>Rank</u>	<u>Nomination</u>	<u>Scheduled Nomination</u>
1	ABC	A-Z	1	200	200
		B-Z	3	100	100
3	DEF	E-Z	4	50	0
2	GHI	F-Z	3	100	0
		G-Z	1	100	100

- Would require a new data element in the nomination data set.
- Sets a rank at the contract level with further ranking within the contract.
- Requires higher priority transactions to be entered under high priority contract.
