

PG&E suggests the following editorial changes to the Proposed Compromise Model (as modified 8/25/97 and updated September 17-18)

1. Re-arrange bullets under each heading so they are read in the same order in which they occur.
2. Use the same footnote to explain “scheduled quantity and bump notices” and “scheduled quantity notices.”
3. Remove references to “unused capacity” and “complete rescheduling of pipeline” because they attempt to define business practices that are more appropriately detailed in an individual pipeline’s tariffs. (At best, these are terms that have not been defined yet.)
4. The terms Cycle 1 and Cycle 2 for scheduling day nominations and Intraday 1 and Intraday 2 for flow day nominations have been used for illustration purposes only.

Reading from left to right on the timeline printout:

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- Intraday 1 nominations sent by 10 a.m. and received by TSP by 10:15 a.m.
 - Confirmations no later than 12:00 noon
 - Scheduled quantity and bump notices* to all parties no later than 1:00 p.m.
 - Flowing by 5 p.m.
 - See NOTE below

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- Cycle 1 nominations sent by 11:30 a.m. and received by TSP by 11:45 a.m.
 - Confirmations no later than 3:30 p.m.
 - Scheduled quantity notices* to all parties no later than 4:30 p.m.
 - Flowing by 9 a.m. next gas day (Day 2)

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- Intraday 2 nominations sent by 5 p.m. and received by TSP by 5:15 p.m.
 - Confirmations no later than 8:00 p.m.
 - Scheduled quantity notices* to all parties by 9:00 p.m.
 - Flowing by 9:00 p.m.

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- Cycle 2 nominations sent by 6:00 p.m. and received by TSP by 6:15 p.m.
 - Confirmations no later than 9:00 p.m.
 - Scheduled quantity and bump notices* to all parties no later than 10:00 p.m.
 - Flowing by 9 a.m. or 5 p.m.** next gas day (Day 2)
 - See NOTE below.

Suggested language for accompanying “footnotes”:

The above nomination opportunities represent times which a shipper should be supported by TSPs and all confirming parties for synchronization across the North American pipeline network or grid. All times are in Central Clock Time.

NOTE: GISB takes no position on whether or not a pipeline bumps. A TSP that has bumping provisions in its tariffs should choose the Cycle 2 nomination cycle and/or the Intraday 1 nomination cycle to implement bumping. Bumping will not be supported across the North American pipeline grid for the Intraday 2 nomination cycle.

* Response from the TSP is in the Shipper’s designated site by the time stated.

** A TSP that has bumping provisions in its tariffs should make a one-time election to allow bumping at 9:00 a.m. or 5:00 p.m. for Cycle 2 nominations. For all other pipelines, flow for this cycle will begin at 9:00 a.m.
