

Enron Discussion Draft - April 6, 1998

Mission of “Internet Look and Feel” Task Force :

Board Resolution: Be it resolved that the GISB Board of Directors requests the GISB Executive Committee to further evaluate such standards as are necessary to ensure that the five postings in GISB Standard 4.3.6 version 1.1 are implemented by Transportation Service Providers in a consistent and user friendly manner including the development of common Web page structures, viewing formats, nomenclature, logon procedures and download capabilities.

Common Web Structures

Principles Passed: 2

Standards Passed: 5,6,8,11,12,13, 14a,15,19,20

Open Issues:

- Frame print doesn't contain TSP Name - Modify Standard 11 by adding “Content frames should have a similar name when printed (title attribute).
- Tariff search by three sections may be time consuming to implement and administer. Standard 13
- Placement of “Other” category is not clear - Change Standard 6 to have “Other” immediately preceding “Download”. Assume we can add other categories as needed since this is a minimum Standard

Common Nomenclature

Standards Passed: 1,5,6,8,14b,14d

Open Issues:

- New Notice Types do not map one to one to current EBB's - if we do not concurrently discontinue non-transactional EBB's we may have to modify existing EBB's - Standard 14d.
- Need to review notice types and determine whether others can be added if needed - IR Subcommittee used existing EDI categories (this is a minimum Standard - would assume can add others as necessary rather than lump in “Other” - Standard 14d

Common Log-On Procedures

Principles Passed: 1

Standards Passed: 2,3,4

Open Issues:

- None

Common Viewing Formats:

Principles Passed: 3,5,6

Standards Passed: 14b, 14d, 19

- How to handle unused columns is not specified. Propose to eliminate column on view and leave blank in download, e.g., Notice list - if notice i.d. not used as reference, no column on view and blank column on download.

Standards Tabled: 16,17,18,21,22

Common Download

Related GISB Standards: 4.3.5 and 4.3.16

Principles Passed: 4

Standards Passed: 3,6,24A

Standards Defeated 26,27,24

Open Issues:

- “Entire Tariff” subcategory” should be clarified with respect to download and print and whether the download should have a standard format, e.g., RTF. Although the intent to download was discussed, this is not clearly defined within the Standards. Standard 8
- Data Manipulation on Excel or Data Base requires ASCII tab delimited file for tables

Standard passed to download Capacity Allocation Log, Operationally Available Capacity, Unsubscribed Capacity and Index of Customers in ASCII tab delimited format - no format or ASCII definition was included - Standard 24A

Recommend download for Index of Customers follow same ASCII format as other reports, e.g., without header/footer records (This enables easy conversion to spreadsheet).- There is also an outstanding request for format with header/footer records - Standard 18,24A

For these download files to be consistent need:

- ASCII tab delimited definition (referred to FTTF)
- Decision needed regarding whether to include headers labels
