Proposed Standards for Consideration  
at the April 24, 1997 Meeting

- 1.2.x "Nomination Transmittal" is defined as a transfer of a collection of one or more Nominations as defined in Standard No.1.2.1 from a service requestor to a service provider . A Nomination Transmittal may be sent via EDI or other means.
- 1.3.x In reference to Standard No. 1.3.10, the phrase "one (1) intraday nomination" refers to a transportation service provider accepting from a service requestor at least one (1) Nomination Transmittal containing one or more Nomination line items for a single Gas Day.
- 1.3.x Transportation service providers should accept from service requestors two intraday nomination line items for each Gas Day for the combination of: (i) service requestor contract(s), (ii) primary delivery point(s), and (iii) available pooling point(s). For example, a single service requestor with two contracts, five primary delivery points, and ten available pooling points would be able to submit, at a minimum, 200 intraday nomination line items ( $2 \times 2 \times 5 \times 10 = 200$ ). The nomination line items may be submitted in one or more Nomination Transmittals, and should not be limited to particular contracts, delivery points or pooling points. For service requestors using released firm capacity or interruptible capacity, the delivery point(s) defined in their respective contracts should be used to calculate the number of available intraday nomination line items. Transportation service providers should not be obligated to execute multiple service requestor contracts or to define additional primary delivery points or available pooling points solely for the purpose of increasing the number of possible intraday nomination line items available to a service requestor.
